Daniel subsequently undertook a DPhil (PhD) in Condensed Matter Physics (bionanotechnology) at Oxford titled "DNA Lattices and Protein Arrays: Novel Approaches to Biological Structure Determination", which was awarded in 2010. His DPhil thesis was examined as "exceptional for a PhD student" and "timely, thought-provoking, and ground-breaking". He subsequently continued his research at postdoctoral level and was elected a Fellow of St Cross College, Oxford University.
